Just a few reminders as the first significant snow fall of the winter is bearing down on us:

Be safe. Do not go out. This storm has the potential to be a historic snowfall.

Do not throw snow in the street. This creates a dangerous conditions. We understand that if there is 30 inches of snow that it will be difficult to “put somewhere” but under no circumstances should snow be thrown back into the street.

Be neighborly, check on seniors and the disabled.

If you have a fire hydrant near your property, do not cover it with snow.

Once the roads become snow covered, parking on the street is prohibited until they are passable again.

Main roads are plowed first, secondary roads are done second and last are the dead ends. Please be patient. Every road will be plowed, it is going to take some time.

We understand the frustration when you shovel your driveway and sidewalk and the plow truck comes back down the road and “plows you in.” Regretfully, this is unavoidable as the plow trucks must have sufficient speed to push large quantities of snow.

Keep your cell phone charged.

If the power goes out, call PSE&G at 1-800-436-7734. It is important that they are notified when your power goes out. Please save this phone number into your cell phone. PSE&G might not know the power is out in your neighborhood. Don't rely on your neighbors to call – call them.
